



We all continue to look ahead with optimism, while knowing the need for flexibility if things should change. With that said, we are offering a worry-free reservation option to give families that opportunity to enroll their child in camp between 6/15/2020 – 8/30/2020, and feel comfortable knowing that changes will be allowed without penalty. We continue to place a priority on the health and safety of everyone at camp.

We have been following guidelines recommended by the CDC and Florida Department of Health. Please see below for our practices that will be in place during camps this summer. In addition to below protocols, during this summer camp season, we are making sure to limit the number of campers as well as the number of people who come on campus to ensure we maintain proper social distancing guidelines.

Prior to camp arrival, we are recommending that campers self-isolate with family members for seven days before their camp begins. They will also be asked to submit a questionnaire within 48 hours of arrival, detailing any exposure they may have had to the virus, and will be asked to go through a health screening with our camp nurses at check-in.

Managing Health & Safety

Facilities:

- All commonly used surfaces will be disinfected regularly including major touch points, door handles, etc.
- Facilities and common areas will be rearranged to help facilitate proper social distancing, which will be enforced and monitored regularly.
- Touchless dispensers containing hand sanitizer with an alcohol content of 70% or greater have been placed in highly trafficked areas around campus.
- In the cafeteria, campers will be given utensils by Food and Beverage staff at meals and will no longer be taking utensils from a common source on their own; we will be limiting buffet style delivery.
- Signage regarding proper handwashing hygiene will be placed around campus as a reminder for campers and staff.

- Gel In/ Gel Out Stations have been purchased for every cabin. All staff will be trained on the utilize the stations every time they or the campers enter and/or exit buildings/cabins/activity stations.
- Teams will be utilized to clean and disinfect cabins, dining hall and activity stations between each group. Program team to sanitize between activity group rotations.
- Professional, Licensed cleaning company will be hired each week to disinfect cabins
- Handwashing Video during training week with glow germ demonstration
 - Portable hand washing stations have been rented for access to wash hands outside prior to entering dining hall
- All outside sheets, blankets and pillows will be dropped on front porch and then sprayed with a 70% percent alcohol spray solution

Visitors coming on to our campus:

- Intake screening will be given to all camp guests, staff and families as they arrive.
- Parents will not be permitted inside cabins during check-in
- Deliveries will be scheduled and handled by trained camp professionals. All delivers will be disinfected prior to using.
- Social Distancing during check in time. We will have identified areas for parents to check in. (Receive a number at your car, program team to use walkies to release families 5 at a time)
- Parents and staff to wear masks during check-in/check-out.
- Consider omitting the Friday showcase. Parents will pick up at the covered sports area.
- FFD to purchase equipment if needed for protection.
- All employees will do their part to support the community. No parents will be allowed to enter campus without protective face masks.
- Check in stations will be moved to the porches of the cabins.
- Hand washing and sanitizing will be encouraged throughout the day by camp staff

Staff and Campers:

- Employees will be going through a health screening upon entering campus each session; those who have flu-like symptoms, will be asked to remain off campus.
- Habitual hand washing and sanitizing advisories and guidelines will be required by employees before and after activities, before and after meals, and during any other group activities as applicable.
- Any employee who has flu-like symptoms or comes in close contact with someone who has flu like symptoms is required to tell their supervisor and will be asked to stay off campus for a minimum of 14 days.
- Nurse Check-in will be limited to cabin 3 and only one parent will be permitted to enter.
- Staff and camper's temperature to be taken daily and logged

- Nursing spreadsheet to monitor temp checks 8am & 8pm
- COVID/Flu intake screenings for all staff, guests and families 48 hours in advance
- Health Center on both sides of camp will be set up. We also will have two sick person isolation areas.
- Sleeping density in each cabin will be reduced and set up in different directions

Food safety:

- Only Food Safe Serve Employees in kitchen with PPE
- No contact protocols
- Hand Hygiene Stations
- Rotating meal times to limit number in dining hall
- Limited use of buffet style serving
- Cleaning and sanitizing will happen before and after each meal
- COVID 45-minute video for all food service employees
- Masks and gloves will be wore during food preparation and serving
